Dear Parents.

School Concerts are all about community building, resilience, risk taking and learning new skills.

They give students the chance to shine and have lots of fun along the way.

In only six weeks the students will hit the big stage at Moorabbin Town Hall for our bi annual school concert. The students are very excited about having the opportunity to demonstrate their talents in the areas of song, dance and drama and are spending many hours practicing and learning new skills.

We are very privileged to have so many talented people on staff and among our parent community who are generously working with the students to ensure that each child has the opportunity to shine.

Tickets will go on sale on 3rd August and can be purchased through the ticketing office at Moorabbin Town Hall. There will be a link to guide you through the booking process in next week's newsletter. We will run two performances on Wednesday 2nd September on what is always an action packed day.

The day will run as follows:

8.30-8.45 Children are dropped off at Town Hall

9am Rehearsals 12pm Performance 1

1.30pm Students are collected from the Town Hall and taken home for dinner and a rest.

6.30pm Students arrive at Kingston Town Hall dressed ready for their 7pm performance

7pm Performance 2

On concert day all students will need to be dropped off at the Moorabbin Town Hall by 8.45am dressed ready for a full dress rehearsal. Carpooling is highly advised. Parents are asked to do a drive through style of drop off at the Town Hall on the morning of the concert where teachers will greet students and escort them into the Hall. There is a slip road off Nepean Highway in front of the Town Hall which is ideal for quick drop offs.

The morning will be spent running through each class through their act on the big stage and making adjustments to sound and lighting.

Please start planning now how you will manage drop offs and pickups on the day of the concert.

Programming-Responsiveness

Children develop social and emotional skills through their relationships with their parents and caregivers. Children who experience warm, responsive and trusting relationships are better able to manage their feelings and cope with the ups and downs of life. (Kids Matter; Growing together in relationships).

Warm, responsive and trusting relationships are built from many positive interactions over time. These occur when the caregiver is 'in tune' with the child's signals and needs, and responds in a warm and positive way: for example, The *Guide to the National Quality Standard* (page 119) reminds us that supportive relationships with educators and staff members allow children to:

- develop confidence in their ability to express themselves
- work through differences
- learn new things and take calculated risks.

Educators can build nurturing relationships that support children to feel valued as competent and capable individuals by:

- actively engaging in their learning
- sharing decision-making with them
- using their everyday interactions during play, routines and ongoing projects to stimulate their thinking and to enrich their learning
- providing opportunities for children to express their thoughts and feelings
- supporting children as they begin to empathise with others, to appreciate their connectedness and interdependence as learners and to value collaboration and teamwork.

Being 'in tune' means that caregivers are able to understand the meaning behind a child's behaviour. Over time the child can trust that their needs will be heard and met by their responsive caregiver. However, it is not always possible to be 'in tune' with children one hundred per cent of the time, especially when faced with competing demands in the environment. What matters is that as caregivers we are warm and responsive in interactions with children and are able to help children manage their feelings by being calm and in control all of the time.

Our responsive staff:















On the flip side, <u>responsiveness</u> is also expected from children. Staff call this being <u>mutually supportive</u> <u>and developing reciprocal relationships with children</u>. During the term staff will intentionally <u>Model</u> (teaching by showing)**Shape** (teaching by approximations) <u>Instruct</u>(teaching by telling) and <u>Teach step-by-step</u>, children about being responsive; that is how quickly and well they should react to something; Through watching and listening to us, they learn what to do and how to do it especially when receiving instructions. Educators will provide consistent opportunities for children to develop responsive communication skills, interpersonal skills, confidence and a positive sense of self in an environment that respects diversity, is safe and supportive and where children have a strong sense of belonging.

We are now taking bookings for the upcoming school closure day <u>Friday 7/8/2015</u>. The planned experiences are yet to be confirmed however the day will be full of child driven interests and entertainment along with a chance to play all day with friends. Activities whilst planned are flexible with consideration for active and passive time and seasonal changes. We aim to provide opportunities for children to relax as well as continue their learning journey through varied and interesting interactions with each other and community partners. 
Would you like be involved in a fun, hands on event?

Gratitude for the Priesthood

This week's Jubilee highlights God's gift to us of the Priesthood. In the time of Moses and Aaron -the Old Testament - the Priesthood began as God's intermediary in worship. This was advanced with the Levites organising Priestly worship, and then surpassed with Christ the Eternal High Priest, who was the sacrifice and the victim, and through the resurrection enabled us to have the opportunity of eternal life. Jesus began his ministry with the calling of his disciples, who were chosen to be the New Priesthood, who would Baptise, Confirm, Anoint, Forgive and above all, preside at the new Last Supper - the Eucharist. This enables us, living two thousand years after Christ, to be Baptised, Confirmed...... and be fed at the Eucharist.

This weekend we thank God for this extraordinary gift of Holy Orders that continues on the ministry of Christ, and pray for all those called to serve in this special ministry, that they do so less unworthily. Fr Malcolm Crawford
