

Literacy



In Literacy this term we will be continuing classroom serial reading focusing on the 'Chronicles of Narnia' by CS Lewis. The children often love to read along with their own copy of the books, so feel free to send it in if they have it. It's a fantastic tale of courage, adventure and faith.

It has been fabulous to see the children reading so well at home. Please continue to read with your children, asking questions and having conversations

about the characters and events of the story. This helps them to develop their comprehension skills as well as fostering a love of reading.

Further to this, we will also be focusing, during literacy sessions, on a number of comprehension strategies to support student's understanding of text and world. We will be examining the main idea of texts, along with identifying figurative language, the difference between fact and opinion, comparing and contrasting, making inferences and summarising.

Writing this term will see the students continue to look at the '7 Steps to Writing Success' in conjunction with the VCOP and Big Write Framework. These are approaches which can be applied to all genres. We will be focusing on the Persuasive and Procedural genres this term.

We will also be having a specific focus on spelling. The students will be revisiting some of the skills from previous years, such as syllabification and phoneme sounds, as well as learning new strategies to help with sounding out and spelling new and more difficult words.

Numeracy

We will continue to encourage students to use a range of strategies when solving mathematical problems, justifying their answer/solution.



Some of the topics we will be covering this term include:

- Length and perimeter
- Worded Problems
- Patterns and Algebra
- Location and symmetry
- Multiplication and Division

Faith Life

This Term our Faith Life topic is 'FOODASTIC!'

That's right! The Year 3s are going to become top chefs as they investigate the chemical and physical changes thathappen to food when we cook it, when we compost it and when we alter it.

We will be discovering how food changes our bodies and exploring the effects of a good, or not so good diet, on our lives.

The students will become scientists as the make predictions and observations about the changes food undertakes over time. We will be Social Justice leaders as we look at the food inequalities around the world, researching what we can do to assist those less fortunate than ourselves.



Homework: Activities, reading diaries and Maths Mate.


<u>Homework Activities</u> will be distributed fortnightly and collected on a Friday, unless otherwise stated. Students are to complete activities in their homework book. In line with our homework policy, **parents** are to correct and sign any work completed at home.

<u>MATHS MATE:</u> As part of of their homework, students will be asked to complete 1 double sided Maths Mate sheet per week. This is to be handed in <u>every</u> Friday. Maths Mate sheets will be corrected in class with the teacher. Parents are <u>not</u> expected to correct the Maths Mate, but asked to sign in the parent signature area.

Please do not stress if your child is finding a task difficult, as we may not have covered it in class yet. If you highlight or asterisk the question/s, we will endeavour to go over them in class together, as there may be other children experiencing similar difficulties.

<u>**READING DIARIES:**</u> The children are expected to read every night and it is to be recorded in their reading diary. This must be handed in <u>**EVERY**</u> Friday

The timing for homework is a total of 30 minutes per night. The recommended breakdown could be a minimum of 15 mins of reading and 15 minutes of the other assigned activities.
