This term is 11 weeks long, filled to the brim with activities and learning. So sit down, buckle up, hang on tight and enjoy the ride!

Faith Life/Confirmation



During Faith Life sessions this term, the students will begin preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation. This is a significant celebration in their journey to becoming fully initiated into the Catholic Church. There is a huge amount of learning that accompanies this Sacrament and so this will be a whole term unit, and will continue next term. The dates for Confirmation are Wednesday, July 25 and Friday, July 27 at 7.00 pm.

The students will investigate the lives of saints throughout history and then make the important decision of selecting a saint with whom they feel connected and aspire to be like. They will have received an information pack outlining the activities, expectations and important dates that you will need to know leading up to Confirmation. Please ensure that you read this thoroughly with your child as it is imperative that you understand what is required and when it is to be completed.

NUMERACY

This term Numeracy will consist of two major units covering a huge amount of the curriculum - Investigating Fractions, Decimals and Percentages and Units of Measurement which covers mass, length, perimeter, area, capacity and time.Please keep an eye out for these particular topics in your child's Maths Mate and when working with your child on their homework.

Literacy

This term in Literacy we will continue to build upon our reading comprehension, writing, and speaking and listening skills. Our focus for comprehension will be finding the main idea, summarising, understanding cause and effect, understanding sequence, learning to draw conclusions from a text, comparing and contrasting, finding the author's purpose, making predictions within a text, and distinguishing between fact and opinion. Our writing focus is information report writing. The students will use the framework to write a biography of the Confirmation saint and the spirit-filled person they have chosen.

WINTER SPORT

This term the students will play in either Netball or Football teams against other local Catholic schools. Year 6 students are to supply 2 cut-up oranges every second week beginning in Week 3. This is a really good opportunity for the children to develop their organisational skills, ensuring that they are fully prepared with all the required equipment for each Friday.



If your child is playing football, it is imperative that they remember their mouthguard each week, as they are not allowed to play without it.



Homework

Homework will continue to be on a fortnightly basis. It will be given out on a Monday and will be due in to school on Friday of the following week, with a couple of exceptions. It is St Finbar's Homework Policy that our parents are responsible for



checking and correcting their child's homework and the teacher is to sight and sign once this has been done. Your child's diary is an important tool of communication and will also be used as a homework planner to help the children manage their time in preparation for Secondary School. The students have written due dates into their diaries as a reminder of when work is due. It is also a requirement that the students <u>read every day for 20 minutes</u> and that this is recorded in their diary and signed by a parent.
